



The Wider Wylye Strategy

The Wider Wylye Strategy brings together a series of projects and programmes of work over the next 5 years which aim to enhance the Wylye catchment for wildlife and people, and increase the resilience of this unique chalk stream in the face of our rapidly changing climate.



Restoring natural processes in our rivers and floodplain.

Enhancing at least 5km of river and 10 hectares of floodplain will benefit the ecological health of the river and wider Wylye catchment.

Education and engagement in the local communities.

Engaging with hundreds of children and adults throughout the catchment each year will build awareness to help protect this unique and fragile chalk stream.



Collaboration with land managers and wider stakeholders. Working together to create a climate resilient natural environment that is nurtured by stakeholders and local communities, laying the foundation for a wide range of natural capital benefits to be delivered in the future.
